More on the Website

"Thank you" to those of you who have emailed us to pour praise onto the new web site. Apart from the fresh new look, there are several features which you may be unaware of.

One of the most interactive is the one which allows you to promote your own page to the front of the queue whenever anyone presses

the 'Members' button on the home page. The default order of display is 'Last Updated' - so just update your page in some way and it will automatically put your name and an example of your work right to the top of the bunch. Try it – it works! I do it nearly every day!

By submitting an illustration the entrant will agree to abide by the following rules:

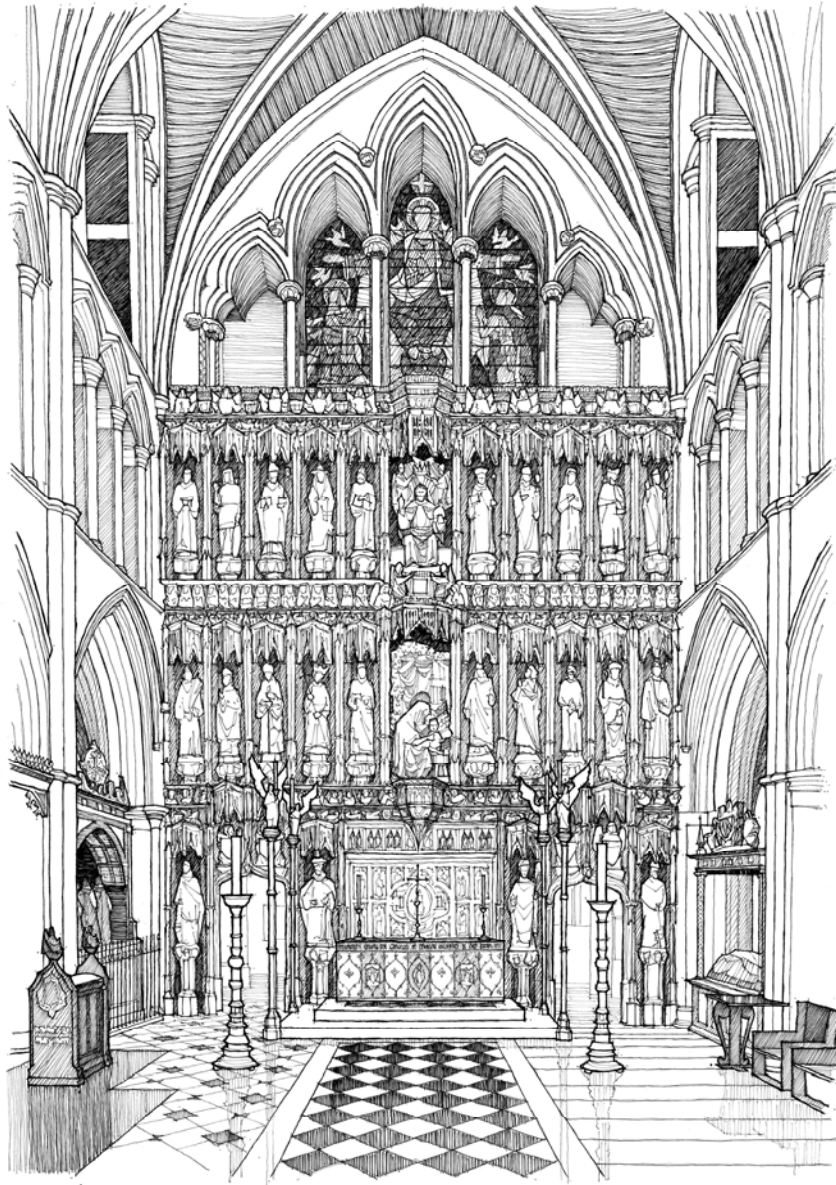
- The illustration shall not exceed 2mB in size and can be completed in any media and shall comply with the given subject matter.

- The winner will be notified by email and the SAI will pay 25 GB pounds by BACS.
- The SAI reserves the right to publish the results and to reproduce the illustration as part of its publicity.
- An illustration posted after the last day of the month on the required subject will not be eligible and will be deleted from the Forum.
- No entrant may win more than once in any three-month period.
- The Forum Administration's decision is final and it reserves the right not to issue a prize for a month if there is only one entry.

I have enjoyed drawing since an early age, but it wasn't until I joined professional architectural practice in 2006 that I began to fully appreciate the value of illustration as a tool for communicating ideas, and as a way of exploring architecture. I was schooled by those around me (including fellow SAI member Robert Towse!) in the traditional arts of technical hand-drawing and perspective construction. Now, as a budding architectural designer/illustrator seeking full RIBA chartered status, I find that my formative hours slaving over the drawing board as a young apprentice are paying off.



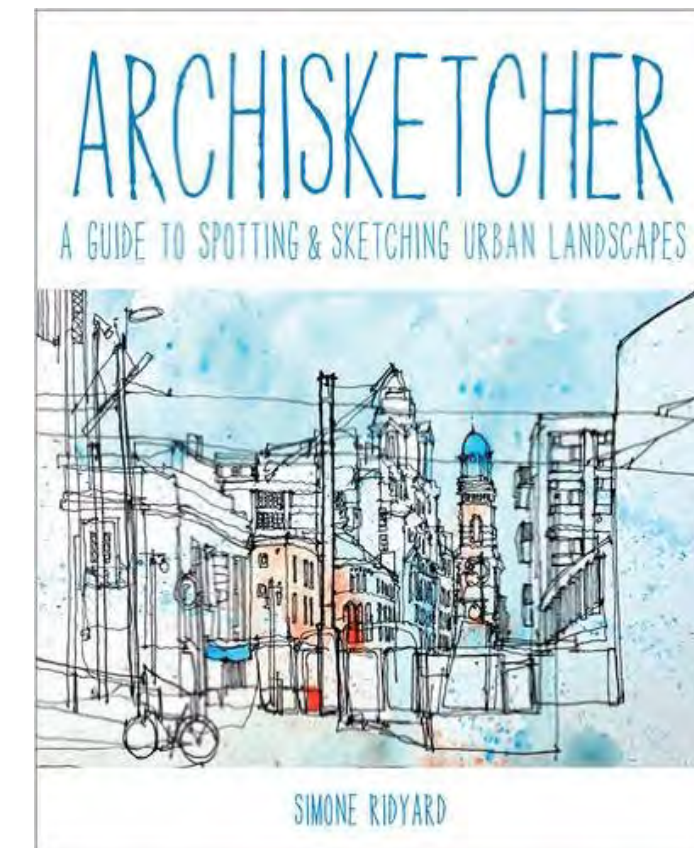
In recent years I have made a move to a fully digital work-flow, marrying the accuracy and flexibility of the CG environment with a traditional hand-rendered aesthetic. As such, I'm now able to draw by hand onto a Wacom Cintiq tablet as a 'digital drawing board', directly into Adobe Photoshop with bespoke pens and brushes.

My ongoing desire to refine, improve and share my techniques brings me to the SAI. With such a wealth of talent in its membership, I look on inspired and proud to have been elected a member of the Society.

Titke of building

Two adjacent buildings are being converted to provide student accommodation. One has an Art Deco Portland stone façade designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott and other, a 1960s building, is being given a Portland stone façade.

A computer model of both existing façades was built, along with various proposals to evaluate the new design. The model was also used by the architects in conjunction with their own model of the rest of the building for the generation of planning drawings etc. Here is a view of the final design.

The model was made in VectorWorks and rendered in Cinema 4D. The montage and final adjustments were carried out in Photoshop. The montage was done just before aligning software became available so that had to be done by eye.

Reportager Awards – Tim Richardson

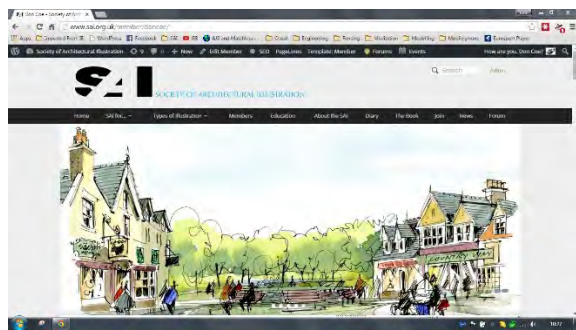

The New Website -Some Useful Guidance

Our new web site has been optimised for all devices including smart phones and pads, so it would be a good idea if you check that the images you upload are of high resolution and the text you choose will enhance your chance of being selected by potential clients.

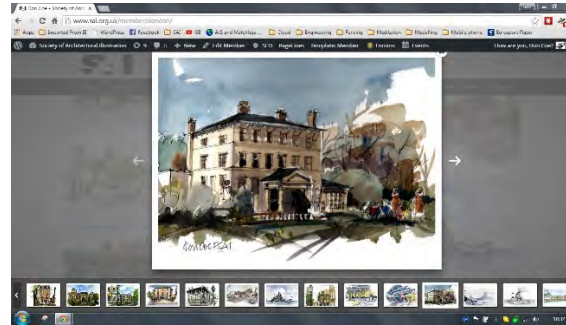
When anyone accesses your web page they will first see a heading banner which features a slide show displaying five of your uploaded images. The banner is full width of the screen. That's why it's important that the images are high resolution!



On scrolling down, the viewer will see the entire library of your uploaded images in **large thumbnail** format...



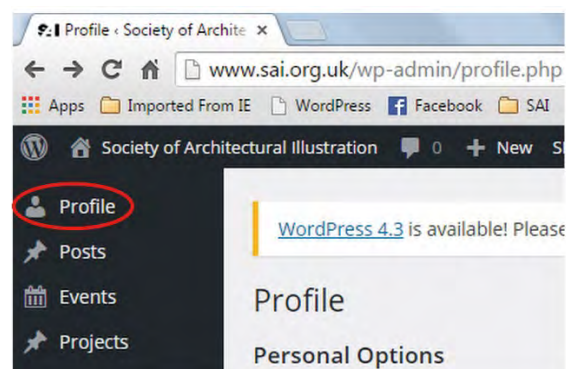
Clicking on any one image will enlarge it and show the remainder as one long strip at the bottom of the page. Clicking on the arrows at either side of the main image will, once again, scroll through all of your uploaded examples.



To edit your page, text or to upload or delete images, go to the top right-hand corner of your web page and click on your name then 'Edit my profile' from the drop-down menu.



When the 'Profile – personal options' page opens go to the left-hand column and select 'Profile'.



That will take you to the 'Edit Member' page where you can change the appearance of your page in respect of text and images. **Don't forget to click on 'Update' before you leave the page ...**



... otherwise you'll need to start all over again!
